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High School Book Review Guidelines
Overall, there are some specific details about how to write a book review for high School. Writing a book review at high school requires students to share own thoughts about the book and conduct an analysis based on task questions and general outline of the stated problem. Usually, high school reviews are not voluminous and take up to four pages of text. Moreover, there is no need to use complex speech patterns or past tenses.

Characteristics of a good review: The review should introduce the reader to the book's content and focus on the subject of the book being reviewed. • Include an exposition of how the book fits into the current thinking on the subject (e.g., a novel approach, an introduction, a magisterial review, the finest book on the subject ever written, etc.). • Avoid repeating its table of contents; rather, give the reader some idea of the author's thesis and how he or she develops it.

The main purpose of a book review is to help other readers to decide if they should read the book themselves. It presents all the main ideas in the book. Book reviews usually include a brief summary of the book, an analysis of the strengths and weaknesses of the book, and usually a rating or recommendation.
