(See IRS Form 990, Part VI, Section B, line 11) For smaller nonprofits that only file the Form 990-N, make sure the board

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knows about the annual filing requirement. Disclose to the public the nonprofit's three most recently filed annual returns with the IRS, as well as its application for tax-exemption and related correspondence and attachments.
