Make sure that the current account that will be used to manage reports is a member of the Local Administrator Group on the SSRS Server. Log in to the SSRS (SQL Server Reporting Service) Server. Open Server Manager > Tools > Computer Management. Local Users and Groups > Groups > Double click on Administrators group. Make sure that the SSRS account that will manage the SSRS is a member of this Local Administrator Group. If it does not exist, add it.
