Generally speaking, guided reading involves teaching groups of children according to their ability levels.

Simply put, guided reading is an instructional approach when the teacher works with a small group (up to 6) of students. The teacher is teaching specific skill or strategy to the small group of readers. These students may or may not be reading the same exact text or at the same exact reading level.

The teacher guides or "scaffolds" their students as they read, talk and think their way through a text (Department of Education, 1997).
