A huge percentage of minorities, such as Vietnamese, Chinese and Chams, lived in the cities, so the policy victimized them more than Khmers, who were the vast majority in the country, especially those areas controlled by the Khmer Rouge as the latter won the 1970-1975 war against the Lon Nol regime. Xenophobic racism informed Pol Pot's incursions into all 3 of his neighbours, Thailand, Laos and Vietnam.
