Though Carter provides some biographical background, her focus is on three of Sade's novels.

The Sadeian Woman investigates problems that the Marquis de Sade raises about the culturally determined nature of women and the resultant relations between men and women. All three texts explore

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the subject-object dichotomy of gendered identity in a predatorial hierarchy.

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The Sadeian woman, then, subverts only her own socially conditioned role in the world of god, the king and the law. She

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does not subvert her society, except incidentally, as a storm trooper of the individual consciousness. She remains in the area of privilege created by her class, just as Sade remains in the philosophical framework of his time.
